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1. INTRODUCTION

Gandhigram was founded in 1947 by a team of dedicated Gandhians led by Dr.T.S.Soundaram and Dr.G.Ramachandran. In 1956 the Gandhigram Rural Institute was started as one of the premier rural institutes administered by the National Council for Rural Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. The Institute attained the status of a Deemed University in 1976. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council conferred FIVE STAR status for a period of five years from January 2002.

2. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Institute are

- (i) to provide instruction and training in such branches of learning as will promote a classless and casteless society;
- (ii) to carry out research and disseminate knowledge; and
- (iii) to function as a centre for extension work leading to integrated rural development.

3. ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The Institute offers academic programmes in several disciplines from post-higher secondary diploma to doctoral level. (Separate prospectus is available for M.C.A. & M.Sc. I.T. and doctoral programmes.)

4. HOSTEL

Separate hostels are available for men and women students. Only vegetarian food will be served. Foreign students' hostels are available.

For certain programmes (as indicated in Sl.Nos. 25a and 26a), stay in hostels/field stations is compulsory.

5. CENTRAL FACILITIES

Dr.G.Ramachandran Library, University Science and Instrumentation Centre (USIC), Health Centre, Students Facilities Complex, Student Cafeteria, Language Laboratory, Placement Bureau, Computer Centre, Yoga Centre, Centre for Entrepreneurship Development, Rural Innovation Work Station, Guidance and Counselling Centre.

6. CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students of the Institute participate in Shramdhan, Shanthi sena, NSS, Cultural Cell, Sarvodaya Study Circle, Departmental Associations, Student Clubs, Sports & Games, Centre for Media and Culture etc. The unique "man making" programme of the Institute goes by the name VSR (Values and Social Responsibilities).

7. EXTENSION WORK

All students and staff regularly undertake extension work in the surrounding community. Under the VSR certain students can take up the role of Residential Change Agents (“Samaj Shilpis”). All the students are part of the NSS.

8. VALUES AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The university’s dream of creating a new world order will be realized only if the youth coming out of its portals are potential leaders of change endowed with global values / vision but with a commitment to pay back their debt to the society by working for its enrichment and self - reliance. This is possible only if they themselves have inner strength and clarity of values. Therefore every programme in the university has “Values and Social Responsibilities” (VSR) as a foundation course. VSR is an action programme, fully linked with the National Service Scheme (NSS), with three components:

- (i) Life Skills and Values;
- (ii) Collective action towards Millennium Development Goals;
- (iii) Societal Entrepreneurship (SE). The SE in turn has:
 - a. Residential Change Agent programme;
 - b. Production / social marketing;
 - c. Constructive programme in the villages.

The collective action programme assembles individual contributions (towards literacy, tree-caring, SHG - monitoring etc.) to achieve the Millennium Development Goals of the selected region.

Village Placement Programme for 7 days in a year is mandatory as part of VSR.

9. MORNING ASSEMBLY AND COMMUNITY MEET

All students and staff shall attend daily morning assembly and Friday morning community meet. The Friday community meet is an occasion for the community for sharing its academic and extension experiences. This is compulsory for all teachers, students and supporting staff. There is an inter religious Sarvodaya prayer at 5.00 p.m. on Fridays.

10. APPLICATION FORM

The application form, with the prospectus, can be had from THE DEPUTY REGISTRAR (ACADEMIC), THE GANDHIGRAM RURAL INSTITUTE - DEEMED UNIVERSITY, GANDHIGRAM - 624 302, either by post by sending a written request specifying the programme and enclosing a crossed Demand Draft, purchased not earlier than the date of the advertisement for admission, in favour of **The Registrar, Gandhigram Rural Institute**, payable at Canara Bank, Gandhigram (Code 8500) or State Bank of India, Ambathruai, (Code 3373), or in person by cash payment / remittance in the Canara Bank Extension Counter at Gandhigram. A candidate may apply for admission to any number of programmes but separate applications must be submitted for each programme.

For Ph.D., the application form will be issued only after fixing the Research Supervisor in the discipline concerned.

11. ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign applicants will be considered if they are recommended by the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. They should produce a valid student visa / research visa (in case of Ph.D.), medical fitness certificate as per the norms of India and a certificate of financial guarantee at the time of seeking admission. If admitted, they will be governed by such rules and regulations as may be framed by the Government of India and by the authorities of the Institute from time to time. The prescribed fee structure for foreigners is two times if the students are from SAARC countries and four times for those from other countries, payable in US dollars.

15. SHORTLISTING ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES

The Institute reserves the right to shortlist the eligible candidates for all programmes.

16. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

(a) **UG / Diploma / M.A. Development Administration Programmes:**

Admission will be made on the basis of marks scored in +2 or equivalent examinations.

(b) **B.Tech. / PG / PG Diploma / Post Diploma / M.Phil. Programmes:**

Selection of candidates for admission to the above programmes will be on the basis of the performance of the candidates in an entrance test. The date of the test will be intimated by post. No TA / DA will be paid for attending the entrance test.

(c) Ph.D. Programme:

Admission will be done twice in a year. Applications will be issued, only on the recommendation of the Research Supervisor, during January and August and the last date for receiving the filled in application will be 31st January and 31st August respectively.

Note: Foreign nationals and JRFs will be admitted at any time.

17. CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

Only provisional admission will be given subject to verification of the original certificates. Admitted candidates must produce the consolidated statement of marks of the qualifying examination by 30th September 2006, failing which their provisional admission will be cancelled. Fees once paid will not be refunded in any circumstances.

18. RESERVATION

For all Indian students admission will be subject to the reservation policy of the Government of India.

19. SPECIAL CATEGORY

Disabled applicants and wards of defence service personnel should furnish appropriate evidence for considering their applications under special categories as per the rules of Institute.

20. RELAXATION FOR SC AND ST CANDIDATES

Minimum pass in the qualifying examination is enough for SC and ST applicants to apply.

21. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

All full-time / part-time programmes except Ph.D. are offered under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS), allowing the students to have a choice in the selection of courses. As per the system, the students, depending upon their ability and interest, can complete a programme early/late (subject to certain conditions), drop / substitute courses, repeat courses during the summer vacation and study inter – departmental / intra-departmental elective courses of their interest. This is a unique flexible education system through which the student can chalk out a unique career agenda for himself / herself.

22. RAGGING

Students who engage in ragging will be dismissed.
